Gentlemen,

It was brought to my attention by Mr. Gene (Ed-Y) Long, Public Works Supervisor of Peralta, that you have some heavy equipment that is scheduled for auction. Mr. Long mentioned that you might consider selling or donating some much needed equipment to our community. We would certainly be able to put it to good use.

The Town of Peralta is one of the newest municipalities in the State, incorporated in 2007, and still has very limited income sources. Being a small municipality with limited GRT income, we do not have the ability to purchase new road equipment at this time. However, we have many roads that are in critical or failing condition, and in desperate need of maintenance. Peralta is a rural community, and a large percentage of the Town's streets are gravel, which require regular maintenance by our Public Works department.

Mr. Long mentioned there may be a way that Sandoval County could offer to the Town of Peralta, a used Road Grader at a discounted price, or possibly a donation. The Town is in dire need of road equipment, and your consideration is greatly appreciated.
