Re: Request for Vehicle Purchase

Mr. Rios,

Due to a series of unforeseeable events within the Corrales Police Department (including the vehicle accident involving Officer Jeremy Romero), we have found ourselves in dire need for patrol vehicles for our police officers. At this time the Village of Corrales is unable to purchase new vehicles to replace equipment that has become damaged beyond repair. The sheriff's department has graciously offered to sell the Village of Corrales three surplus vehicles at a cost of \$1.00 per vehicle. Two vehicles will be used as patrol vehicles within our fleet and issued to full-time salaried police officers and/or pool replacement units. The third vehicle will be utilized by the Corrales Fire Department as a response vehicle for Fire Command personnel and to assist in response to mutual aid requests within Sandoval County.

At this time I am requesting the approval of this government to government transfer and accept the sincere appreciation of the Corrales Police Department, Village of Corrales.
