“CORONADO SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT DAY”

Whereas, the original Coronado Soil and Water Conservation District was formed as the Santa Fe-Sandoval Soil Conservation District on December 18, 1941, as a result of the dust bowl; and

Whereas, William Kiesov, Frank Calvin, Henry Gonzales, Ricardo Romero, and Antonio J. Baca, supervisors for Santa Fe-Sandoval Soil Conservation District, presented to Sandoval County, on the 26th day of July 1950, an application for a certificate of inclusion of additional territory within the Santa Fe-Sandoval Soil Conservation District; and

Whereas, the Soil and Water Conservation Districts are independent subdivisions of State government governed by boards of supervisors, local landowners, and residents elected or appointed to the board for a four (4) year term; and

Whereas, the Soil and Water Conservation Districts is authorized by the Soil and Water Conservation District Act (73-20-25 through 73-20-48 NMSA 1978) to conserve and develop the natural resources of the State, provide for flood control, preserve wildlife, protect the tax base, and promote the health, safety and general welfare of the people of New Mexico; and

Whereas, many individuals of the Coronado Soil and Water Conservation District have worked endlessly for years to protect and maintain the Piedra Lisa Dam and many water ways for the residents and various communities in Sandoval County.

Now therefore be it resolved, the Board of County Commissioners, the Governing Body of Sandoval County, hereby recognizes the important contributions that Coronado Soil and Water Conservation District makes to the communities of Sandoval County and proclaims August 22, 2014, as ***“Coronado Soil and Water Conservation District Day.”***

We consistently seek to not only maintain our success but expand to allow for further growth and make beneficial enhancements to our existing programs.

HWAU serves veterans that have become lost in the gaps of the VA and other "like" service organizations. Our objective is to provide necessary resources to veterans (disabled & otherwise) who don't have homes, family, benefits, etc. We provide and assist with transitional housing, finding & obtaining employment, education, food, vehicles, benefits, health care, and the list continues. There are currently six (6) established resident veterans living on the Heroes Walk Among Us VCRC (Veterans Community Resource Center) premises.

Our request for \$3,000.00 funding would be utilized towards completing code & zoning requirements for the Heroes Walk Among Us VCRC per the city of Rio Rancho:

- 6 entrance doors required to open "outward" (\$200.00 per door w/ frame)
- 6 security push-locks (\$250.00 each)
- Installation (TBD)
- Fire Escape Window (VCRC Upper Level) \$800.00
- Fire Escape Stairwell (VCRC Upper Level) \$7,000.00-\$15,000.00 (quote range)
